Mages "Forever Young" Program

Respond by February 05, 2012



Goal: To give incentive to Exercise and reach a Healthy Weight and have fun doing it.

Privacy: This would be strictly a family program, NO ONE, Except one or two monitors will ever need to know your weight. This will be an honor system. We know you are all honest about whether you're exercising or not. You will weight- in on your scale at home every week. We will officially weigh-in at the start of the program, at the summer family reunion, at Christmas and again at the year end.

Carrot: This could give you the incentive to reach your goal weight, and get in shape.

Whip: For each week that you don't make progress toward your goal, you will be fined.

For each week that you don't exercise at least 3 hours, you will be fined, even if you reached your goal weight.

1. **Who:** Anyone can join, if under 18, you need your parents permission and supervision. You will be in for one year when you can opt out or set new goals for the next year, even if it is just to maintain your weight.

2. **Fines:** Your fines will be based on a scale, if for instance you start at 252 pounds, and have a goal to reach 200 pounds in one year, you would need to lose one pound every week. If on week 4, you weren't down at least 4 pounds, you would have to pay a fine. You would also get fined for gaining weight back, so if by week 3 you had lost 6 pounds, but now on week 4 you're only down 4 pounds, having gained 2 pounds back, you would pay a fine or you're at your goal weight, but you're getting fined for gaining weight back. You will also pay a fine for not exercising regularly, at least 3 hours per week, split up however you like. If you find yourself turning things into exercise that you previously didn't consider to be exercise, or you use regular chores as exercise then throw you fine in, you're only kidding yourself. THE FINE WILL BE MONEY, AND THE SIZE OF THE FINE WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE INDIVIDUAL PERSON. You know what will motivate you, make it hurt a little.

So You Can be Fined 3 ways. 1. For not reaching your goal this week, 2. For not getting in your 3 hours of exercise this week, 3. For gaining weight.

Weight-Ins: Weekly on your own scale in your own home, you know if you need to pay a fine. You may be able to fool us for a little while, but unless you're honest with yourself this won't work.

3. **Where will the money go. Two places:**

A. To the people who have reached their goal after one year. All the winners will share in ½ of the total fines. They can vote to go to any event together of their choice, Valley Fair, Mall of America, Chanhassen Dinner Theatre, A concert, State Fair, You get the idea, it's totally up to that group.

B. The other half will be shared equally as a scholarship for any descendant of Alphonse and Barbara that are in college. They must be in college at least one semester during our year of the "Forever Young" program.

Your weight would not be published anywhere, but reaching goals, getting fined, size of pot, etc would be published periodically in the "Family Reunion". You gotta have incentives you know.

After everyone that wants to signup, has signed up, we'll have one meeting to set or change any rules we feel will enhance this program. We will also elect the monitors and treasurer and then do our official weigh-in. IF YOU'RE UNABLE TO COME TO THIS MEETING, you can weigh- in wherever you are. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

MCGA President Mages sets priorities

John Mages of Belgrade was elected president of the Minnesota Corn Growers Association in September by the organization's state board of directors. Other officers elected at that time include Tom Haag of Eden Valley, vice president, Ryan Duck of Goodhue, treasurer, and Bruce Peterson of Northfield, secretary. Their terms began October 1 and run through September 30, 2013.

John Mages, 54, raises corn and soybeans on his farm in Belgrade in Stearns County. He has been involved in leadership positions with MCGA for nearly six years, most recently serving as its vice president.

"The single most important issue now facing farmers is what's going to happen to the next farm bill," said Mages. "What kind of protection will the farmer have if there is a collapse in prices or a collapse in yield? What kind of bill will help Middle America stay healthy – we need a viable safety net that can be successfully maintained within current federal budgetary constraints. We also have an important message to bring to the public about ethanol, and that is to remind people of the importance of energy independence – depending on foreign oil is a risk not only to our national security, but also to our economy. Growing the renewable energy industry – with farm-based energy strongly represented in the portfolio – is the way for America to step away from its unhealthy addiction to oil."

Among his formative leadership experiences, Mages counts as most important his participation in the several classes of Minnesota Agricultural and Rural

Leadership (MARL) program. This is a competitive two-year program of seminars that brings together 80 rural leaders to learn about regional, state, national and global economies and how farming and other sectors of the economy fit within these systems. The seminars each take place in a different location around the state, to help participants become familiar with all of the state's regions and network with leaders in these places. The MARL program also includes a week-long experience in Washington, D.C., as well as a week-to-ten day international experience.



Mages also has taken part in the Syngenta Leadership Training program, which brings candidates together at Syngenta's world headquarters for training in a range of leadership skills.

"One of the most important underlying concepts we took home from MARL is that, if you want to have a say in what the future will be for yourselves or your kids when it comes to agriculture, then you have to get involved," said Mages. "Organizations like Minnesota Corn Growers are the means for keeping America's farmers prosperous and independent, through well-thought out policies and laws that are based on thorough scientific research. It takes grower leaders to step up and carry these messages to the public, and to elected officials."

Corn Growers find Gopher relationship continues to be a "win-win"



Minnesota Corn Growers Association has teamed up with University of Minnesota Gopher Sports for the second year to help promote the similar qualities shared by the two home-grown entities. Both MCGA and the Gophers are vital components of our state's history and culture, explained John Mages, MCGA president, and fostering a closer relationship between the two entities is a great way to remind Minnesotans of the benefits Minnesota's corn farmers and Gopher athletes bring to the North Star State.

Throughout the sports year, MCGA will have a large messaging presence in Gopher venues and media outreach, including messaging and signage in the three major University of Minnesota sports facilities (TCF Stadium – football, Marucci Arena – hockey, and Williams Arena – basketball and

wrestling). Additionally, MCGA ad explaining farmers' commitment to conservation practices and environmental stewardship will play on the Gopher Sports Network.

"There is already a strong link between the University and Minnesota's corn farmers," Mages explained. "Many farmers are University alumni, and we fund and support a wide variety of University-conducted research. And, we work closely with University personnel at their Outreach Centers to help increase understanding of good agricultural practices. Not only that, but we send our kids to the U for a first-rate education and supply quite a number of 'home-grown' athletes for Gopher teams. Associating ourselves with a world-class institution like the University of Minnesota is a win-win situation and we're proud to be a vital part of Gopher Nation," said Mages.
