Grocery Shopping by Mom

I remember when there were no carts in grocery stores. A lot of product came in bulk displays- such as a barrel of "pickles" or kegs of sugar, brown sugar, cereals, rice, raisins among other things.

Mother would make a list. We had so much of our own food on the farm, but there were other things we'd need. We would drive to Olivia on Friday night or Saturday afternoon, and make it a gay occasion.

While we went to the movie, Mother took her list to the Halliday grocery store. Uncle George and Aunt Emma were the owners. In the back of the store they would take in eggs, cream, poultry, fur pelts, etc. Aunt Emma would take the list, and start packaging bulk products that Mother needed. A pound of this, two pounds of that. She would weigh the amount – put it in a brown paper bag, and tie it with a string. The string came in a huge cone, and it was hung in a special hangar above the counter, hanging down. She'd fold the bag down, and tie a couple rounds of string around it, and place it in a box. She had a keen eye for judging the size of the box by the size of the list. Sometimes more than one box, there seemed to be a big supply of boxes, all sizes. Many customers would save the string, and add on to the ball of string at home. The string came in handy for many things.

Flour and sugar also came in hundred pound bags, salt also in fifty pound bags. Oatmeal was always on the list, Dad had oatmeal every morning for breakfast. Rock candy also, it was a favorite, and chocolate candy was a huge treat.

There was some fruit and veggies available, but if anyone had an extra supply, they were glad to sell it. So when Mother took her strawberries and raspberries to the store all ready displayed in small boxes. Hallidays grocery was happy to buy them.

We kids would go to the movie. For a dime admission we would see a double feature. Mostly cowboy shows – Gene Autry, Roy Rogers, Tom Mix, Hopalong Cassidy, were some of them. Also the Lone Ranger, Tonto and many others. The good guys always wore the white hats. The theater would be full. Saturday night was always "bank night." Ticket stubs had a number, and if you were lucky you might win a cash prize. \$5.00 was a big prize, many \$1.00 prizes.

The women were given a piece of "depression glass." Mother had a set of these beautiful glass dishes in pink. They also came in bags of flour, and certain products. Some depression glass was green or gold also.

The Sleepy Eye Flour Mill gave out Chief Sleepy Eye pitchers, sugar bowls, cups, and glasses in their bags of flour. They are very scarce, and valuable collector items today.

Bechyn used to have free movies at one time. A big screen was set up not far from Grandpa and Grandma Kojetin's house. I remember one of the movies that was shown. It was about zombies. It was so scary I think I had some scary dreams after that. That's why I remember it. To think Zombies are back again this day and age. BACK TO GROCERY SHOPPING!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

Carts in grocery stores started being used a few years after Alphonse and I were married. I believe Jenkins in New Ulm was the first store to use them – a predecessor of HyVee. Page 3

We used to shop in Morton at the Mercantile which was a general store, it had clothing, dry goods and groceries, and at Al Hemeke's grocery, locker and frozen food storage. Jim Ryan's grocery came in after the Mercantile closed. Morton used to be a bustling town with a hardware store, drug store, bank, shoe store, doctor, (Dr. Lenz), lawyer, barber, plummer, carpenters, three restaurants, liquor store, four gas stations, auto mechanics, hatchery, bakery, the big hotel by the railroad track that was also another restaurant, blacksmith, grain elevator, feed stores, Morton granite quarry, lumber yard, city hall which doubled as a center for weddings, and events, three churches and of course the school. We had wonderful teachers that taught a lot of smart kids. I can't forget the farmers that lived in the area and supported the town.

Alphonse and I had settled on a farm four miles south of Morton close to where Jackpot Junction Casino is today, just south of the Indian Reservation. We lived on this farm for twenty years from 1946 to 1966 when we moved with our fifteen children to a farm by Sleep Eye.

Distinguished Service Achievement Award



Joe at Play



JOE GALL, a former Wanda area native, displayed a Ford vegetable garden tractor among the 77 on display at Wanda's Cracker Days observance. There was little segregation among the green, orange, red, yellow tractors, but they gave Joe a lone area among the displays at the Wanda Park. The tractor was somewhat unusual that it was a 1955 model which Joe purchased several years ago. Leaving Wanda in 1968 he settled in Sleepy Eye and ran a lumber yard there until retirement. This model had narrow big rear wheels and a single wheel in the front, presumable to have less problem steering in the garden. The tractor has 3 transmissions on three levers to go really slow and a fast road gear. This model has a one arm loader with hydraulic just on one side. "it can pick up a lot of items," Joe added. The tractor is painted a lite grey and a red-orange. Old timers checking over the rig noted that Larry Pelzel Equipment in Wanda sold loaders like this one but probably not the one on Joe's rig. Joe resides at rural North Mankato and keeps busy mowing lawns. He drove this tractor Sunday into Lamberton and buzzed along at a good clip.

This article was on the front page of the Lamberton, Mn. Newspaper. On August 20th. Joe figured approximately 30 tractors traveled from Wanda to Lamberton on Sunday.
